Sprayer Tank Cover

"It's an inexpensive way to double or possibly triple the life of plastic sprayer tanks," says Western Equipment Covers of its new protective tarps.

Designed for 850 and 1,250 gal. ovalshaped tanks, the slip-on cover, made of 10 oz. polyvinyl chloride, protects against the sun's ultra-violet rays, "the worst enemy of plastic tanks stored outside. This costly deterioration of unprotected tanks is intensified during the winter months because of the sun's glare off snow," the manufacturer points out.

The red-colored form-fitted cover carries a "cold crack rating" of -40 degrees F. It's resistant to rot and mildew and is quick and

easy to install or remove. "With normal wear and tear, we anticipate the cover will last ten or more years," says the manufacturer.

Covers currently available for 830-850 gal. Bourgault, Brandt, Flexicoil and Harmon tanks, and for 1,250 gal. Brandt and Flexicoil tanks. Retail cost (Canadian dollars) is \$189.95 for the smaller cover and \$259 for the larger one.

It's made of .073 wall galvanized pipe, making it "chew-proof and rust-proof, and giving it unmatched strength for containing the biggest and orneriest horses, cattle, exotics and other animals. A special powder coating process gives the fence its attractive, permanent white finish. It never needs painting and, unlike vinyl and similar fencing, doesn't deteriorate when subjected to extreme annual weather swings—from 40 below to 100 degrees F. above zero in many areas."

The oval-shaped galvanized iron rails are about 3.5 in. wide and 1.5 in. thick. They have tapered ends and couple together in 10 ft. long sections.

Cost (Canadian dollars) of a standard 3rail white fence, with posts spaced 10 ft. apart, is right at \$12 per running foot installed, and \$10 if you install it yourself prices subject to change). Other colors, and 4-rail fence, available on special order.

"One-Legged" Fence Staple

New from Lovco Sales & Service is a "one legged" fence staple that offers "54% more staples per pound than conventional double shank staples."

Regular staples have sharp points, making it virtually impossible to carry them in your pant's pockets. Grab a bunch from the bag and you end up with bloodied and bruised fingers.

Not so with the new "one-legged" Ring-Shank staple. It gets its name from sharp threads cut into its single shank, giving it its excellent holding power, and handling ease. "You can grab a handful from the bag without stabbing your fingers. Or, you can load them into the pockets of your \$75 designer jeans without worry of damage or discomfort."

If you'd like to try the new 1.5 in. bright steel "one legged" staple, you can buy a 2-lb. sample packet (about 150 staples) for \$5. A 25 lb. bag sells for \$48 (Canadian dollars).

Self-Unloading Round Bale Mover

It only takes about five seconds to unload the revolutionary Tri-Haul round bale mover. You simply pull a lever and the entire load —up to 18 bales — rolls off slick as a whistle.

One man working alone does it all with this one lever — without hydraulics, winches or chains.

You load the Tri-Haul from the rear with a spear attached to your tractor loader bucket or from the side with a grapple, stacking up to 18 bales in three rows.

Once loaded on a trailer or truck flatbed, you leave the tractor in the field and haul the load to headquarters, at road speed, with your pickup or truck.

"You save both time and money by leaving your tractor-loader in the field and not having to drive it back and forth," the manufacturer points out.

The self-unloading trip lever can be set

to unload both sides simultaneously, or one side at a time. When the bales roll off, coil springs automatically pull the loader's hinged side cradles into narrow, road-legal transport width (8 ft., 6 in.). As bales are loaded onto the Tri-Haul frame, their weight automatically pushes the side cradles down to their wider "load" position, allowing the mover to accommodate three rows of bales.

The Tri-Haul is available as a low-profile model to fit existing flatbeds, a highprofile model for low-slung flatbeds, and as a self-contained unit with its own hitch (bumper or gooseneck) and axle system.

Prices (Canadian dollars) range from \$1,774 for a 5-bale Tri-Haul to \$3,889 for an 18-bale model.

"Bow And Arrow" Livestock Vaccination Kit

"So far as we know, it's the first and only one of its kind on the market," says Medi-Dart of its new "bow and arrow" livestock vaccination kit for treating individual animals on pasture, or in the feedlot or pen, without restraining them.

Medi-Dart makes a 6 ft. long "pole syringe" which requires that you get within 6 to 8 ft. of the target animal. "With our new bow-fired syringe, you only only have to be within about 30 ft from the animal — or even farther away as your marksmanship improves," the manufacturer points

The kit, consisting of a 40 lb. bow, a special-made "arrow" syringe, and a hand-operated bicycle pump, retails for \$179 (Canadian dollars). The syringe needle is grooyed on the surface, causing it to stick to the animal for about 10 seconds while the vaccine (up to a 30cc dose) is being injected, and to prevent vaccine from leaking out. After 10 seconds, an air-operated "kick off" device activates, causing the reusable syringe to eject and fall to the ground before the animal runs off with it.
